Ministry of Health/Ontario Health Highlights:	 Ministry Highlights The Minister of Health has assigned the Ontario Health Team (OHT) Continued Implementation Supports Funding Transfer Payment Agreement (TPA) to Ontario Health (OH). The effective date of the assignment is October 1, 2022. There is no change in TPA deliverables. Ontario Health Highlights A letter was sent to the Director, Integrated Care and tri-chairs which outlines the understanding of continued partnership with North and East communities and the AOHT. A draft application from the Part B: OHT Regional Collaborative was submitted to the Leadership Council for feedback. The feedback collected from the Leadership Council will be brought back to the working group for consideration. The revised application will be sent back to the AOHT for signature prior to November 23, 2022, should the Leadership Council approve. Maamwesying OHT The Maamwesying OHT was officially announced as approved as an OHT. As there are catchment areas that overlap with the AOHT, the AOHT looks forward to continuing to build partnerships with Maamwesying OHT in the coming months.
Governance Sub- Committee Highlights:	 The governance sub-committee will be reconvening in early November to discuss next steps in anticipation of receiving prescriptive guidance from the Ministry/OH regarding OHT expansion and membership. Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) Extension Leadership Council is to ensure that their respective organizations return a signed MOU extension until March 31, 2023, should their Boards approve, prior to the existing MOU's expiry date of October 31, 2022. Leadership Council members are encouraged to communicate with Victoria Aceti Chlebus on what each of their needs are to gain the approval from each Board.

Leadership Council Highlights:	Executive Committee Update The selection committee for the primary care tri-chair position consists of Victoria Aceti Chlebus, Dr. Jodie Stewart, Ali Juma, and Dominic Noel. A role

description has been developed. Once approved, the committee will begin the recruitment process.

OB/GYN Coverage in the community

The Leadership Council discussed the challenges the community is facing surrounding OB/GYN coverage and the heavy reliance of locum OB/GYN services. Organizations can expect additional communication in the coming days.

Youth Wellness Hub

Leadership Council member Ali Juma gave an overview of the Youth Wellness Hub to the attendees. A Youth Action Council will work closely with the Youth Wellness Hub Coordinator for the duration of a year. There is also a multiagency collaborative working to get the hub up and running, as well as planning for service provision.

Home and Community Care Support Services

Home and Community Care Support Services signed a participatory agreement with OHTs. A letter was provided to the Leadership Council that outlines the parameters of this agreement.

Over the course of the initial cycle, over a dozen patients were on-boarded onto the pathway. A Quality Improvement meeting assessing results from PDSA Cycle 1 took place on September 7, 2022 with actionable next steps to improve for the next cycle. Work continues on the following four projects: • Early Frailty Identification in Primary Care: The Algoma Nurse Practitioner-led Clinic has stepped forward as a pilot site for the early frailty identification project. The advisory team is reviewing the evidence of the selected screening tools with an anticipated go-live latefall. • Patient Navigation: Ontario Health has invested in a provincial-wide multitenant navigator (MTN) which will be attached to Health Connect Ontario. The provincial MTN is an initial starting point, but will not fulfill the AOHT's	

			required deliverable of 24/7 patient navigation. • Coordinated Access to Geriatric Services: The project team continues to make progress to collaborate on a common referral form and intake process for the SAH Algoma Geriatrics Clinic and Seniors Mental Health and the Superior Family Health Team. It is anticipated that testing the form and process in November 2022. • Outpatient Geriatric Rehabilitation: The project team has taken time to review the available data to understand the patient population that would benefit from an outpatient geriatric rehabilitation program. With both quantitative data and anecdotal information, the team is formulating a program.

The team continues to explore opportunities for improvement by engaging with clinicians, health leaders and community partners as to next steps.

We are currently planning to put a video together with patients speaking to these values and develop some signage/digital content.
